Special Collaborative Programme 179:
"Water and Matter Dynamics in Agro-Ecosystems"

The main objective of this major longterm program is the analysis and forecasting of effects which farming and natural properties of specific sites have on energy fluxes, water fluxes, matter dynamics, microclimate and organisms. Fifteen different institutions and university departments are participating in the program and working in 18 subprojects.

Apart from a wide range of experimental work, the programme will include the development and application of models.

The programme is divided in six divisions as listed below:

Matter Dynamics of Agro-Ecosystems Division B: Regionalization/Remote Sensing

Division C: Basic Structures and Pro-

Division D: Biogenic Matter Dynamics and Bioindicators

WORKING GROUP "COASTAL MANAGEMENT"

Brief information about the European Workshop and Symposium:
"Perspectives in Coastal dune management: Towards a dynamic approach.
Contributions to nature conservation and development".
The Netherlands, 7-13 September 1987

Organization:

Dutch Foundation for Dune Conservation in cooperation with the International Association for Landscape Ecology.

Coastal dunes are typically characterized by a high diversity of species and environments, in the Netherlands as well as in other European countries. At the same time, however, these coastal landscapes are very attractive for a large number of human activities, because of their location and their land qualities. Outdoor recreation, tourism, harbours and industry, wind-energy catchment and, nowadays, atmospheric deposition, are threatening the fragile dune ecosystems. Conditions for natural processes are changing. The problem of how to make use of the dunes, while at the same time conserving them is an enormous challenge to ecologists, planners and politicians. Recognition of the problem clearly urges society to develop and improve upon

guidelines for a rational balance between exploitation and conservation and to develop new perspectives for the future development of dune landscapes.

Their value, their fragility as well as the way in which dunes are being threatened lead to the formation of the (Dutch) Foundation for Dune Conservation.

The Foundation for Dune Conservation plans to organize an international week with a workshop and symposium in 1987, on the occasion of its 10th anniversary. The central theme of the week will be "conservation and development of coastal dunes in Europe". Experts on research, planning and management are to be invited. Scientific discussions and field trips together should contribute to new perspectives in the management of coastal dune ecosystems. The emphasis will be on the specific dynamic characteristics of the coastal dune landscape. Recommendations will be made with a view towards planning, management and applied ecological research in The Netherlands and in other European countries.

The dunes fulfill several important functions for society. There are four main types of land usage which will be the topics of the meeting:

- nature conservation
- coastal defence
- recreation
- drinking-water catchment.

In the workshop the term 'coastal dunes'

will be interpreted in a broad sense. This means that dune ecosystems will be treated including important relationships with the sea and foreshore.

The workshop is spread over 4 days (and 2 optional days). The workshop will offer introductions to the 4 topics mentioned; field trips to study a number of dune areas and their management; an international poster presentation; and ample time for discussion. The meeting will be concluded by a one-day symposium. The main part of the workshop has a limited number of attendants, but the symposium and most of the lectures in the first part of the workshop are open to many. During the symposium conclusions and recommendations will be formulated, largely based on the activities of the workshop. Further, an international organization will be set up to promote conservation and development of dune areas and adjacent coastal ecosystems in Europe.

The aims of the workshop and the symposium are:

- To stimulate international interest and collaboration in the conservation and development of coastal dunes in Europe;
- To promote regular international exchange of know-how and experience in planning, management and research in order to come to a joint strategy for nature conservation and development, taking into account the main types of land usage;

- To present and discuss experiences in The Netherlands;
- To make a survey of endangered coastal environments in Europa;
- To establish an international foundation for the conservation of coastal environments in Europe based on an integration of disciplines.

The conference will be held at the Institute of Physical Geography, Dept. of Complex Physical Geography of the A. Mickiewicz University in Poznán, ul. Fredry 10, in the days of 26-29th October 1987. It will consist of a three days session, included a poster session, and an one days excursion concerning the theme "Landscape-ecological problems of the suburban zone of the city of Poznán, including the Wielkopalska National Park.

The only language of the conference will be English, when translation will be

needed it will shorten the time accorded to the presentation.

In the aim to somewhat "canalize" the discussion we offer You (our "auto da fe" in the form of) an one page text "What is urban ecology" and ask You to consider it as a point of departure for the discussion.

What is urban ecology?

It is a special kind of ecology, different from such one as was conceived by E. Haeckel and developed later by A. Tansley, E.P. Odum a.o. Its differentia scientifica lies in the fact, that the organisms, that are concerned in this ecology, are Humans, that are supported in their household not only by natural, but equally by additional, artificially formed resources, represented especially by fuels, than in abundance by tools and on the top of it by extrabiological information, coming from culture. These resources enable Humans to survive, to

preserve their lives with such an efficiency, that they succeeded to reach the number of 5 milliards - an enormous achievement of organisms, mammals, of such size and of such living habits. This human ecology is, like ecology of other forms of life of organisms fundamentally dependant upon the special way of life as it is proper to Humans. In the course of development of Mankind it reached the stage of urban way of life, where Man lives in the overpowering dependance of additional supply with matter, energy and information, this last one expressed by "urban infrastructure". In this frame Man lives in his "most human" environment - called then "urban milieu" and forming a special interaction system: an urban system. Urban ecology is also a part of human ecology. It is a synthetical science, in a synecological level of ecology, that is supported by the analytical fundamental base of human ecology on the autecological level.
