CONGRATULATIONS: SANDRA LUQUE AND MÁRIA KOZOVÁ **ELECTED FOR IALE VICE-PRESIDENTS**

In June and July 120 members voted in the elections for two new Vice-Presidents for the Executive Committee of IALE. The result of the election was as follows:

The 120 votes correspond to 7% of the IALE members. The distribution grouped by major regions is as follows:

Although the distribution of votes correlates with the geographic distribution of members, there are large differences in the participation from country to country. The nomination committee feels that the 7% votes are by far to low to call the process a success. It is however a substantial increase compared to the 2003 election. Thus we observe an increasing interest in IALE.

The nomination committee expresses its thanks to all members that responded to the voting, and especially to the 5 candidates that were willing to run for the different positions.

Portraits of the members elect of the board:

Dr. Mária Kozová is an Associate Professor and senior researcher, deputy head of the Department of Landscape Ecology, Comenius University in Bratislava (in 1992-2003 a head of the Dept.). She has an MSc in physical and regional geography, her PhD thesis was on the topic: "Quantitative Assessment of Geometric Aspects of a Landscape Structure". From 1972-1992 she was a researcher and senior researcher in the Institute for Landscape Ecology Slovak Academy of Sciences. In 1997 she presented her habilitation thesis on "Landscape-ecological Principles of Environmental Planning". She has been a co-ordinator and key co-worker in projects with orientation on carrying capacity, landscape planning, environmental impact assessment, sustainable development and local Agenda 21. In 1986-1989 she was a secretary of the East-European region of IALE and since January 2004 she has been a chairman of the Slovak chapter of IALE. Her ideas for the post of vice-president are:

- o to improve the co-operation of IALE regional chapters with the aim to accelerate the implementation of international conventions dealing with landscape,
- to encourage collaboration among landscape ecologists, professionals from related disciplines and decision-makers in the solution of environmental problems,
- o to promote educational and training activities oriented to awareness-raising on values of landscape an on sustainable landscape development.

Dr. Sandra S. Luque: Born in Argentina. Did her MSc and PhD at Rutgers University (New Jersey, USA). Her PhD thesis concerned the Structure and Dynamics of the New Jersey Pine Barrens Landscape. She was a former NASA Research Fellow on the Global Change Program-Earth Observing System (EOS-USA, 1991-1994). She was among the first three Latin Americans granted this fellowship when the program opened to students worldwide. She was Co-PI for the Earth System Science Education and Training Program within the IAI (Inter American Institute). At present she is a trained and active project manager working in France as a senior researcher at Cemagref (Institute for agricultural and environmental engineering research). She has international experience working in different environments and building capacity on remote sensing/GIS

and Landscape Ecology for MSc & PhD level in the UK, Finland, Greece, France and Argentina. At the present she is the co-ordinator for the Finnish Forest Research Institute for the FP5 EU-BIOPRESS, Co-ordinator for PROHAB (A Hierarchical Approach to Protect Forest Biodiversity in the Finnish Forest) for the Finnish Ministry of Environment. She is serving as expert for Cemagref in ALTERNet (FP6-A Long-term Biodiversity, Ecosystem and Awareness Research Network) and PEER (Partnership for European Environmental Research). As a Vice president for IALE she wants:

- o to improve communications within IALE at the international level. In particular to create a network of scientists with common goals on landscape ecology oriented research that can bridge activities between the North and the South.
- o to promote the establishment of the Latin American Chapter
- o to promote educational initiatives for young researchers from developing countries in order to orient their research interests towards landscape ecology with the financial support that is needed.

JOURNAL LANDSCAPE ECOLOGY: MESSAGE FROM THE EDITOR-IN-CHIEF

Dear Readers of Landscape Ecology:

There has been a significant delay in the publication of the 2005 issues of Landscape Ecology. Although the first three issues for 2005 are now online, printed copies are still in production. The sole reason for this delay was a suite of technical problems which were caused by the merger of Kluwer (former publisher of Landscape Ecology) into Springer (current publisher of Landscape Ecology). As the new Editor-in-Chief of the journal, I have been communicating with the publisher constantly since February 2005, and this delay has been very frustrating for me and the Publisher. Landscape Ecology was not the only journal that suffered this serious delay. I sincerely apologize to the subscribers and readers of the journal, and appreciate your patience and understanding.

The good news is that the first three issues are now in print and will be mailed shortly, and the even better news is that, once the new Springer system is in place, the journal will enjoy a higher standard of quality. So, the future of the journal is bright. Also, I am pleased to report that the impact factor of Landscape Ecology in 2004 rose to 2.092, a big jump from 1.08 in 2003. The unexpected sharp decline of the impact factor in 2003 was more than likely due to the delay in the publication of several issues between 2002 and 2003. However, with an increasing number of high-quality manuscripts being submitted to the journal, I am confident that the journal will continue to rise in its academic reputation and influence in the years to come.

Landscape Ecology is the flagship journal of the International Association for Landscape Ecology (IALE), and may also be regarded as a performance indicator of the field of landscape ecology. The articles published in the journal reflect what landscape ecologists do and how well they do it. Therefore, all of us as landscape ecologists are responsible for continuously improving the quality of the journal and making it truly one of the best in ecological and interdisciplinary sciences. Working together, we can achieve this goal, and we will.

Again, I greatly appreciate your patience and understanding, and thank you for your continued support for the journal. Please consider submitting your next great manuscript to Landscape Ecology! Should you have any comments or questions regarding the journal, please don't hesitate to let me know.

A SUMMIT ON ENVIRONMENTAL MODELLING AND SOFTWARE (FOR SUSTAINABILITY)

A Summit on Environmental Modelling and Software (for Sustainability) will be held in Burlington, Vermont from July 9-12, 2006 (see http://www.iemss.org/summit). It incorporates the Third Biennial Meeting of the International Environmental Modelling and Software Society. The aim of the Summit is to enhance sustainability outcomes and decision processes by:

- o Establishing the state-of-the-art in Environmental Modelling and Software theory and practice for integrated assessment and management
- o Identifying research and practice for advancing the requisite knowledge base and tools, and their wider usage
- Initiating and consolidating research partnerships for systematic studies that acquire, capture and generate knowledge platforms

The Summit is built around a very innovative program of workshops (some 15 at present), as well as the more standard sessions (another 15 or so) with presentations. We refer you to the website and accompanying blog to examine which existing workshops and/or sessions you may wish to join - in which case you should contact the organisers of that session and join the blog. Workshops are designed to inspire discussions on most important topics in the field. Organisers will produce a rough draft of a Position Paper on the issues (opportunities, challenges etc.) by the end of November. All workshop participants would at least be required to have an abstract and may join in the review and authorship of the Position Paper. These papers and abstracts will be peer-reviewed and prepublished in the Summit Proceedings before the Summit. We will reserve at least one book in the Elsevier IDEA Series (http://www. elsevier.com/wps/find/bookdescription.cws_home/BS_IDEA/description) that will publish a chapter on the findings of each workshop and their Papers. For standard sessions there will be a more formal structure where there is a 20 minute slot for presentation, and FULL papers for these are mandatory, albeit with a timeline of February 2006 for submission to reviewers. We have reserved several special issues of international journals for a selection of the Proceedings Papers.

The proposal for an IALE working group (WG) on training and education was approved through the IALE executive Committee on 15.07.2005. Now the idea needs to be developed and more IALE members encouraged to participate. It is proposed to organise the first official meeting during the next IALE world congress in Wageningen 2007, and elect an Executive Committee/Borad of the WG.

The training and teaching in Landscape Ecology is aimed at different levels (Master- and PhD level and possibly consultant training).

The aims of this working group are to:

- o achieve an overview of existing courses (see existing initiatives as listed below);
- o link to existing teaching projects/initiatives (see below);
- o co-ordinate and assess teaching and training in the field on an international platform;
- o develop criteria for selecting PhD and related courses linked to IALE conferences (an-nouncement through Expressions of interest):
- o to asses and co-ordinate the existing (diverse) credit point system;
- o to promote the needs for teaching and training in our field; ando to set up funding sources which allow students to attend PhD courses linked to IALE congresses/research activities.

A future goal could be to get courses in Landscape Ecology and related subjects (landscape research in general) accredited. See for example RICS (Royal Institution of Chartered Sur-veyors, http://www.rics.org/default.htm).

There is no membership fee for the Working Group. However members of the Working Group must be registered IALE members, or need to become one within the next 12 months. Become a corresponding, active member or even considering standing for a post? Being an Active member means that I could expect the person to respond to my emails, provide feed-back etc. A corresponding member means that you would receive news, but are not ex-pected to respond. In Wageningen the following positions need to be elected: chair of the working group and a representative to the IALE council. However there is the possibility to elect more active posts, like "curriculum officer", "publicity officer", "literature officer", "credit system officer".
